## When Can I Return to School?



The purpose of this fact sheet is to outline when your student can return to school after having COVID-like symptoms.

## When can someone with SUSPECTED COVID-19 return to school?

Suspected COVID-19: a person who shows symptoms of COVID-19 and has not been tested or is waiting for test results.

Anyone who has symptoms and has <u>not</u> been tested should remain at home and can return after:

- At least 10 days from when symptoms began
- AND 24 hours after fever has resolved (without fever-reducing medication)
- AND symptoms have improved.
- AND after your son/daughter has been cleared by the Rose Hill Elementary contract tracer.

Anyone who has symptoms and has been tested for COVID-19 and **received a negative result\*** can return after:

- 24 hours after fever has resolved (without fever-reducing medication)
- **AND** other symptoms have improved.
- AND after your son/daughter has been cleared by the Rose Hill Elementary contract tracer **OR** you have presented your negative covid test results\* to the Rose Hill Office Staff

This guidance applies to all individuals who have symptoms of COVID-19, even those who have been fully vaccinated.

\*Only molecular (PCR/NAAT) COVID-19 test results will be accepted.
