We are very excited to launch a school community shared read experience of "Wishtree" by Katherine Applegate! The New York Times bestselling story of kindness, friendship,


and tolerance will bring our community together in a new way!

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO NOTE

#### **Covid Information**

We have been getting questions about students missing class for vaccine appointments or for students staying home due to side effects after the shot. See below for guidance on when to stay home. All absences related to COVID-19 will be excused. Let us know if you have any questions.

I just got vaccinated and have side effects that are similar to COVID-19. Do I have to stay home?

Is it COVID-19 or a vaccine reaction? (wa.gov)

You may return to work/school and not quarantine within a few days of vaccine administration, IF:

- You HAVE NOT been in contact with someone with COVID-19 AND
- You feel well enough and are willing to perform normal activities such as work or school AND
- You do not have a fever AND
- Symptoms are LIMITED ONLY to those observed following COVID-19 vaccination: Pain, Redness, Swelling, Fatigue, Muscle Aches, Diarrhea, Nausea, or Headache.




